## MOUNT SORRELL.

**M**OUNT SORREL is a market town, seven miles north from Leicester, and four miles south from Loughborough, situate at the extremity of a ridge of rocky hills, which extend into Derbyshire. This place is celebrated for its granite or sienite stone, many of the houses are composed of complete and unhewn masses of it, and it is considered to be superior to

all other kinds, for hardness and durability. A castle formerly stood on a hill called Castle Hill, built by Hugh, Earl of Chester, in 1174. St. Peter's Church is an ancient edifice, with square tower and three bells: Rev. Thomas Pruen, Incumbent. Christ Church was erected in 1844, at the sole charge of Miss Brinton, a Berkshire lady: Rev. W. G. Pritchard, Incumbent.

## QUORNDON.

**Q**UORNDON, or Quorn, a village, township, and chapelry, in the parish of Barrow-on-Soar ;  $2\frac{1}{2}$  miles S.E. from Loughborough ;  $8\frac{1}{2}$  miles north from Leicester ;  $1\frac{1}{4}$  miles west from the Barrow Railway Station ; 108 miles from London. The Church dedicated to St. Bartholomew, is a large ancient structure, the living, a perpetual curacy, is in the incumbency of the Rev. Robert Stammers, M. A.

The Baptists, Wesleyan, and Primitive Methodists have chapels here, The manufactures are principally lace and hosiery.

Quorn is celebrated as the head quarters of the Leicestershire hunt; Sir Richard Sutton, Bart., is the master of the hounds.

The charities amount to about £80 yearly. Thomas Cradock, Esq., and Edward Basil Farnham, Esq., M.P., are lords of the manor.

Gas Works are now erecting for supplying Quorndon and Mount Sorrell.
