## August 1914 - The First Men Called to the Front (v2 1 Feb 2019)

In mid-late August 1914 a list of the names of the men who had been called to the Front was put together, probably by the village War Emergency Committee. It lists the Regulars, Reservists, Territorials and Yeomanry who had been immediately mobilised at the outbreak of the war.
